Contingent on the referendum's passage, several companies have pledged a combined \$30 million toward the school's construction. The donors include Wenger Corp., which manufactures a variety of products for arts performances; architectural glass manufacturer Viracon; and Mayo Clinic Health System-Owatonna. The largest contribution comes from Federated Insurance, at \$20 million. Federated also purchased and donated the nearly 88-acre plot of land at the southeast corner of the city on U.S. Highway 14 where the high school will be constructed.

"We've believed for a long, long time that quality education is a major factor in attracting people to live and work in the Owatonna community," says Jeff Fetters, Federated's chairman and CEO.
