

Statewide Issues That Impact Business

Tax Competitiveness

The top priority is enacting tax relief for pass-through entities by reducing rates for business income and adopting federal conformity with Section 179 expensing rules.

Environmental Sustainability

Foster both environmental sustainability and economic growth by driving private investment, business starts and jobs in Minnesota while helping employers reduce environmental impacts.

Health Care Costs

Support requiring a cost-benefit analysis before any proposal to add insurance mandates to state law.

Workforce Development

Support private sector initiatives to increase employer engagement in the training of workers, and support policies that ensure student readiness.

Workplace Management

Enacting employee wage, benefit or scheduling mandates on private employers should be outside city authority. We support statewide preemption of local government labor mandates.

Bonding

We support the Steele County Free Fair's request for funds to help them bury power lines on the fair grounds-a safety concern. We support the Rochester International Airports request for funds that ensure on going commercial airline traffic regionally.
