High Time This Road Opens:

Highway 14 cut the ribbon on a key segment of road in 2021 opening four lanes from



Rochester to Owatonna and completing all the way to Mankato. The road signals safter, faster connections to key communities and has been a priority of the Chamber and City for 40 years.

▶ Snubbed for 3 Years, Workforce Center Re-open:

Funding changes forced WDI to close Owatonna's workforce center making this community the only of its size to be without. Pleas from the chamber, businesses, WDI, Representative Petersburg and Senator Jasinski resulted in direct funding from the state and it is open here.

Slow But Steady Rebound

The tourism Industry has started to rebound thanks to tournaments and other events like the SCFF. The pace of the recovery remains slow and uneven across the region due to high oil prices, vaccination rates and traveler confidence. But the future looks brighter for the tourism industry. The start of 2021 was bumpy with the month of January being the lowest occupancy we've seen (22%) since the beginning of the pandemic 20 months ago. Once the winter months passed and vaccines were released, we saw occupancy



climb up to 63% by June of 2021. Sporting tournaments and events like Corky's Early Bird Classic and the Steele Co Free Fair lead the way and helped our hotel occupancy rate along with generating a steady stream of visitors for our local shops and restaurants this year.



Attendance, Spending in Tourism **Looking Up**

- There is strong evidence that concerts, festivals, sports, and other bigger events are expected to return to pre-pandemic attendance numbers. The forecast is showing a perfect storm in these area from pent up demand and the savings rate among those that have not lost their jobs and are making up for lost time.
- The 2021 Steele County Free Fair

attendance numbers were down from 2019 but, vendors saw an increase in revenue this year. · Sustainability will be the focus in the future of tourism. It's not just about the environment and lowering carbon emissions, it will be about working on being more diverse and inclusive, using technology for the greater good and of course our environment.

Radio Network Grows to 19 Stations

The power of local radio has always been a priority of Blooming Prairie Farm Radio. With its roots dating back to starting the Linder Farm Network in Willmar, Minnesota, Lynn Ketelsen has been serving local communities for over 40 years. In 1996 Lynn and his partner John Linder were able to build KOWZ FM in Owatonna, Minnesota. From there Blooming Prairie Farm Radio was able to acquire KRUE FM and what is now KFOW AM.



Thanks to incredible support from the local communities in south central Minnesota, Blooming Prairie continued to see robust growth. Lynn and John were able to add stations in Rochester and Fairmont, Minnesota in the coming years. In 2018 Lynn Ketelsen and David Linder merged all their markets together and Lynn began helping with operations of the stations in Mankato and Marshall, Minnesota.



Today, Blooming Prairie Farm Radio helps operate 19 radio stations in Southern Minnesota. It also has a digital presence and is responsible for many events throughout the year. Lynn Ketelsen is still going strong as the "Voice of Minnesota Agriculture" on the Linder Farm Network.

Radio is an industry with an exciting past, but an even more exciting future. It is the one true media partner that is free and available 24 hours a day. Our stations feature a variety of formats, but we always emphasize staying local and serving our listeners with local, regional and national information. We are proud of our history in the radio industry, and excited about what the future holds for this vibrant medium of radio.

Today, Lynn is joined with a partnership with Matt Ketelsen, David Linder and David Legault to grow our stations into what they are today. Blooming Prairie Farm Radio is still committed

to its heritage of local broadcast service.

There is no doubt that the strength of the Owatonna Chamber and the Owatonna Business Community was one of the main driving forces behind the success that the radio group has seen over the past several years. The relationships that were and continue to be forged by showing up to meetings and helping each other is what makes Owatonna special.
