## How Policy and Economic Development Impacts the Business Community

### Learn to Earn Initiative Moves Forward

How can Owatonna equip high schoolers, then move students on to post-secondary to tackle the talent needs of local employers? It's a challenging question. The Owatonna Partners for Economic Development (OPED) is leveraging relationships with Senator Jasinski, Rep. Petersburg, the MNSCU system and Riverland to create a new plan. In a special appropriation we're requesting \$1M in funding to put mechatronics equipment in the new Owatonna High School and in Riverland's Owatonna campus. Additionally, dollars will go to an environmental scan, basically a needs assessment for future higher education needs.

## Business Legislative Push

As the legislature pushes on with a \$9+B surplus here are the business community priorities:

- Replenish the Unemployment Insurance (UI) Trust Fund
- Offer tax relief
- Enact employer friendly workforce strategies
- Facilitate innovation and productivity
- Oppose additional mandates and workplace restrictions
- Streamline inefficient regulation.
