Jason Bastyr (Mayor Candidate)

- Hello, I'm Jason Bastyr, and I'm seeking your support to become the next mayor of Owatonna.
- I hail from Owatonna, spent my formative years in Faribault, and am a proud graduate of Faribault Senior High School, class of '97. Fourteen years ago, I returned to Owatonna, drawn by its exceptional community and schools, and it's been home ever since.
